DAVAO CHONG HUA HIGH SCHOOL CHOSEN AS A HISTORICAL LANDMARK

A particular school in Davao City's Sta. Ana. Avenue has been in operation for 98 years. Davao Chinese High School was established on June 3, 1924, with only thirty-grade school pupils. The school was officially launched in a rented facility on San Pedro Street. There were just two classrooms in the entire building. The school provides both Chinese and English programs and a dual curriculum with the Chinese Program aimed at preserving and propagating the Chinese language, traditions, and heritage.

Because of its long history, Davaoeños see this institution as a landmark in Davao City. Numerous students have...

In the last 100 years, a lot has transpired, including the production of numerous professions such as engineers, surgeons, and even NASA scientists. Since its founding in 1924, they have intended the school to be a part of our city's rich heritage. Davao Chong Hua High School admitted many Chinese citizens from different towns and provinces long before other Chinese schools were established. As a result, the school became a focal point for many Chinese.

The school is renovating and improving all departments, particularly the teaching and non-teaching elements. The school's productive culture, procedures, and policies are maintained. Administrators, instructors, and staff collaborate to realize the school's vision and goal regularly and continuously. Davao Chong Hua High School has witnessed the various contributions her alumni have made to society over the past 98 years. Davao Chong Hua High School, a Filipino-Chinese school in Davao City, is a possible historical landmark. Davao City has 91 landmarks as of 2018, and it has already cleared the second review for approval in April 2022.

CHONG HUA CONDUCTS FIRE DRILL IN PREPARATION FOR IN-PERSON LEARNING

On the 27th of April 2022, with the safety of the school and its students in mind, a fire drill simulation was conducted by the DCHHS staff as preparation for the incoming Face-to-Face Classroom Teaching.

The drill was precluded by splitting all teaching and non-teaching personnel into eight groups, each corresponding to a specific role. For better efficiency and organization each group was assigned a specific role: Fire Fighting, Communication, First Aid, Rescue, Security and Traffic, Evacuation and Transport, Salvage, and

safety teams.

In order to practice the execution of these roles, the staff was given a scenario wherein a brownout takes place simultaneously with a small fire burning through building one. They also had to worry about a teacher who has supposedly fainted in the Computer Room.

The simulation began with the proxy emergency alarm as each group enacted its responsibilities. The Fire Fighting Team extinguished the fire, the Evacuation Team reported the missing staff, and the Rescue Team retrieved... cont. p. 6

ALL VOICES SHALL BE HEARD: THE PHILIPPINE ELECTION 2022

After the three-month campaign period, with a 13-page list of prohibitions saying that there will be no more cash giveaways, guns firing money, real guns, and armored vans now that the official campaign period for the Philippine presidential elections has started despite the pandemic. A tough fight aiming to ensure a peaceful, smooth, and fair election that took place last May 9, 2022. With some of the restrictions from the COMELEC, the candidates are not allowed to buy votes, public officials cannot release funds, and those who want to carry firearms

need special permits from the election commission.

On "The Day", early counting of votes put Mr. Ferdinand Marcos Jr. the son and the namesake of the country's former dictator is bound for the Presidency of the Philippines together with his presumptive Vice-President-elect, Ms. Sara Duterte-Carpio, a daughter of the former President of the country Mr. Rodrigo Duterte. Within the day, Mr. Marcos gathered more than 15 million votes ahead of his top presidential rival in one of the country's most consequential elections that happened in the... cont. p. 6

Russia has accumulated over 100,000 Russian soldiers on the Ukrainian border and seized Crimea in recent months. This has fueled worries in Kyiv and the West that Moscow may launch a new conflict with its neighbor and former province, which opted to leave Moscow's political orbit. A prominent Ukrainian military analyst told Al Jazeera in January 2022 that Russia might attack Ukraine as early as January 2022, triggering a "short and triumphant" conflict.

The first war crime trial of the invasion will be heard in Kyiv. Vadim Shysimarin, a commander of Russia's Kantemirovskaya tank division, is suspected of shooting and killing a 62-year-old man riding his bike and chatting on his phone in the Sumy village of Chupakhivka. According to prosecutors, Shysimarin was told to "murder a civilian so that he wouldn't denounce them to Ukrainian defenders."

In order to achieve this, Elon wants to

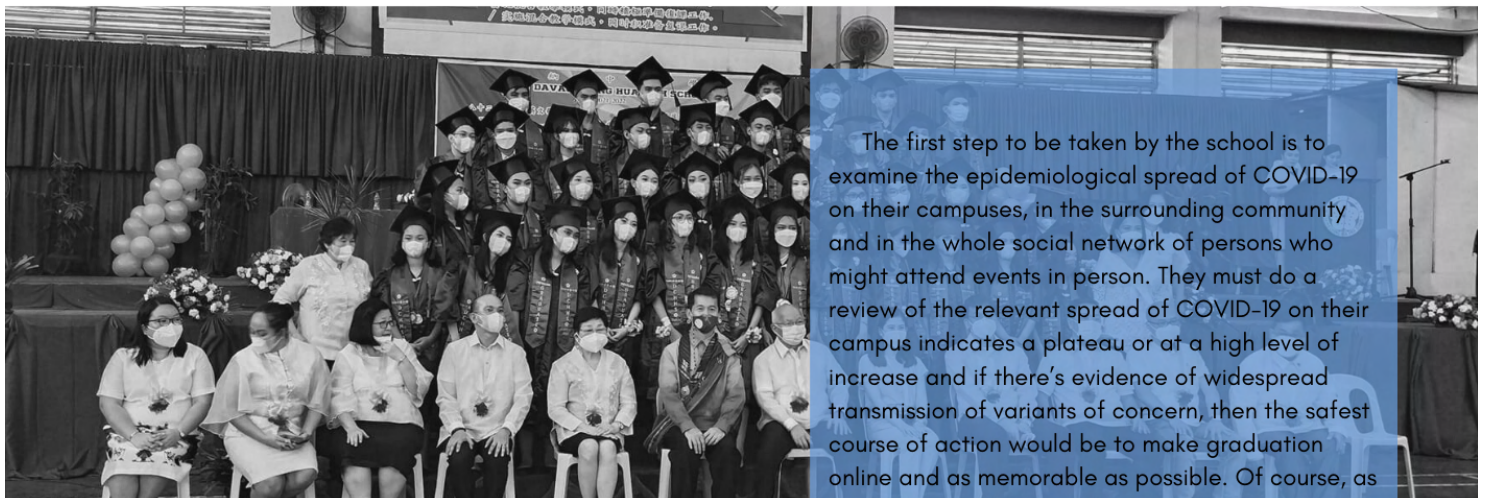


open source the platform's algorithm and make sure that it is transparent about its actions to ensure that there are no underhanded business methods.

COMMENCEMENT FACES CHALLENGE DURING THE PANDEMIC

This graduation season carries many challenges for various schools. Moving up, commencement, and graduation day is a milestone that marks life-changing accomplishments for many graduating students, their families and their friends. Yet, unfortunately, our country is at a crisis at this moment in the COVID-19 pandemic. Although safe and effective vaccines are rolling out quickly still there are number of cases and new variants are now emerging and may be more transmissible and even worst kind. Therefore, our authorities are doing their best- in terms of vaccine uptake, mask use, physical distancing, hand sanitization and other safety protocols to prevent such virus from spreading.

The first step to be taken by the school is to examine the epidemiological spread of COVID-19 on their campuses, in the surrounding community and in the whole social network of persons who might attend events in person. They must do a review of the relevant spread of COVID-19 on their campus indicates a plateau or at a high level of increase and if there's evidence of widespread transmission of variants of concern, then the safest course of action would be to make graduation online and as memorable as possible. Of course, as desirable as online or deferred ceremonies are from a public health point of view, some people will object because they understandably wish to mark this great milestone in face to face manner. If an institution decides to hold an in-person graduation, it should take a number of other steps to help reduce COVID-related risk. Those would include minimizing the number of faculty and staff members on campus who are managing the event, allowing student participation in small waves, and limiting each graduate's activity to hearing one's name read, walking across an outdoor stage and having a memorable but strictly solo photo taken. Further, everyone present should be fully vaccinated before the ceremony. Besides limiting the absolute number of guests, should only allow one companion and when they attend they must adhere to all regulations applied to students, faculty and staff.

Ultimately, each school will have to make a complex and difficult decision for its graduation. But whether online, delayed or carefully managed in person, being cautious and strategic about event management is another contribution all of us and it can make toward creating an environment that is as safe and equitable as possible for everyone.



All Voices Shall Be Heard: The Philippine Election 2022

...country for decades. On the other side, one of the biggest surprises in the Philippines' 2022 presidential election has been the outpouring of

"Generation Z" and millennial support for Ms. Leni Robredo, the former Vice President and an outspoken critic of the President she served under, Mr. Rodrigo Duterte. Several of those supporters are first-time voters or are too young to vote too.

It was at 7 in the evening, Monday when the polls closed according to the Philippines Presidential Election update from "The New York Times", that all the malfunctioning voting machines, insufficient backup machines, and complaints that voters had been left off registration rolls, and that their ballots had been tampered with. Still, Mr. Marcos's lead was so strong early Tuesday that his victory appeared nearly inevitable. Official counting begins Tuesday and is expected to go for a few days.

Early Tuesday, Ms. Robredo stopped short of conceding defeat but acknowledged a "feeling of real dismay among our ranks." "We have not failed," she assured her supporters, speaking from her hometown in the Bicol Region. "We are just starting. An avenue has opened and it will not shut down. A movement was born and it will not die at the close of counting."

Nevertheless, a victory for Mr. Marcos is likely to lead to further erosion of democracy in the Philippines, where institutions have been obliterated or weakened under Mr. Duterte. His promise to shield Mr. Duterte from an investigation by the International Criminal Court for a violent drug war that has claimed thousands of lives has many fearing that impunity for the power will only deepen. As of May 13, 2022, the UniTeam tandem of Mr. Ferdinand Marcos Jr. and Davao City Mayor Ms. Sara Duterte-Carpio was still leading the board with more than 31 million votes for them.

After Finland's president, Sauli Niinistö, and prime minister, Sanna Marin, stated the country must seek Nato membership "without delay," the Russian foreign ministry in Moscow indicated it would have to take "military-technical" actions if Helsinki applied. Within days, Sweden is anticipated to follow suit. According to rumors, Russia may shut off gas supplies to Finland on Friday after Finnish politicians announced their intention to join NATO.

Ukraine vs. Russia

According to the UN's refugee agency, the number of individuals who have fled Ukraine to avoid Russia's invasion has already surpassed six million. Within Ukraine, an additional eight million people were affected. According to the UN Children's Fund, around 100 children were killed in Ukraine in April alone, but the actual number might be far higher. Omar Abdi, Unicef's deputy executive director, called for a halt to the bombardment of Ukrainian schools, claiming that one out of every six Unicef-supported schools in eastern Ukraine had been "damaged or destroyed" as of last week.

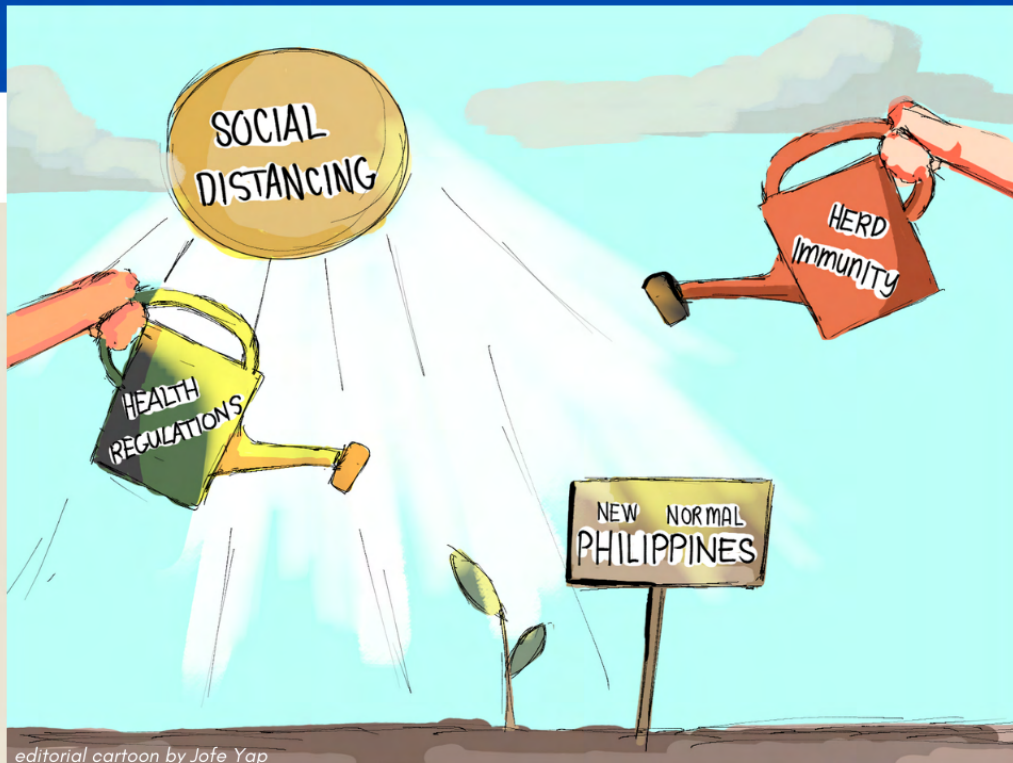
As per the French foreign ministry, after over 80 days of the Ukraine and Russia invasion, European Union leaders aim to evaluate Ukraine's membership next month. The United Nations Human Rights Council has endorsed a resolution calling for an investigation into alleged Russian troop violations in areas of Ukraine that were previously under their authority to hold those guilty accountable. The resolution was carried by a large margin, with 33 votes in favor and two votes against China and Eritrea.

Elon Musk buys Twitter

It's definitely not from the standpoint of 'let me figure out how to monopolize or maximize my ownership of Twitter but we'll try to bring along as many shareholders as we're allowed to,' Elon expressed.

However, many are skeptical about his objectives and methods. People are wary of a billionaire taking over one of the most influential platforms. Early interviews state that Elon wants to turn Twitter into a private company from being a publicly traded company and make it subscription-based.

Elon Musk is one of the richest billionaires with a net worth of \$219 billion dominating the technology and telecom industry. This status has created a lot of debate as to whether he is fit to own and handle Twitter. Expanding upon his intentions, he said, "This is not a way to make money... My strong intuitive sense is having a public platform that is maximally trusted and broadly inclusive is extremely important to the future of civilization. I don't care about the economics at all."

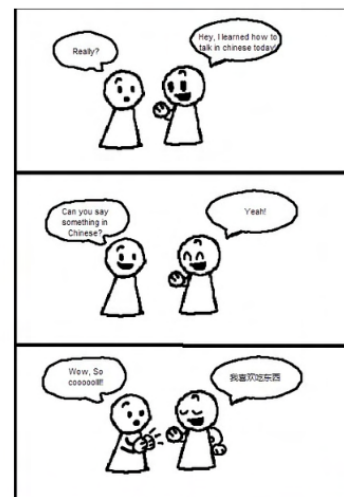

Covid-19 so far

Covid-19 is a deadly and contagious respiratory illness caused by an infection wherein the first case was initially identified, detected and confirmed in Wuhan, China last December of 2019. The viral transmission of the said virus to people is very fast. Because of the rapid escalation of covid cases and mortality despite the accelerating efforts of the affected countries to decrease or if not, control the spreading of the virus, Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, World health organization's (WHO) Director-General characterized COVID-19 as pandemic because it is now a global health crisis.

A lot of studies have been made by the experts and scientists about Covid -19. Its severity has gone more than what was expected. It greatly affected the people worldwide. Since the day it commenced in 2019, the number

of deaths and survival has remained unpredictable. As provided by the World Health Organization, an overview on the global epidemiological update on Covid-19 from January 2022 to present are as follows, to wit:

- As of 23 January 2022, over 346 million confirmed cases and over 5.5 million deaths have been reported worldwide. The Eastern Mediterranean Region reported the largest increase in the number of new cases (39%), followed by the South-East Asia Region (36%) and the European Region (13%).
- As of 20 February 2022, over 422 million confirmed cases and over 5.8 million deaths have been reported globally. The number of new weekly deaths increased in the Western Pacific (+21%) and the African (+20%) regions, and decreased in the South-East Asia (-37%), the Regions of the Americas (-9%), the European (-5%) and Eastern Mediterranean regions (-4%).
- As of 27 March 2022, over 479 million confirmed cases

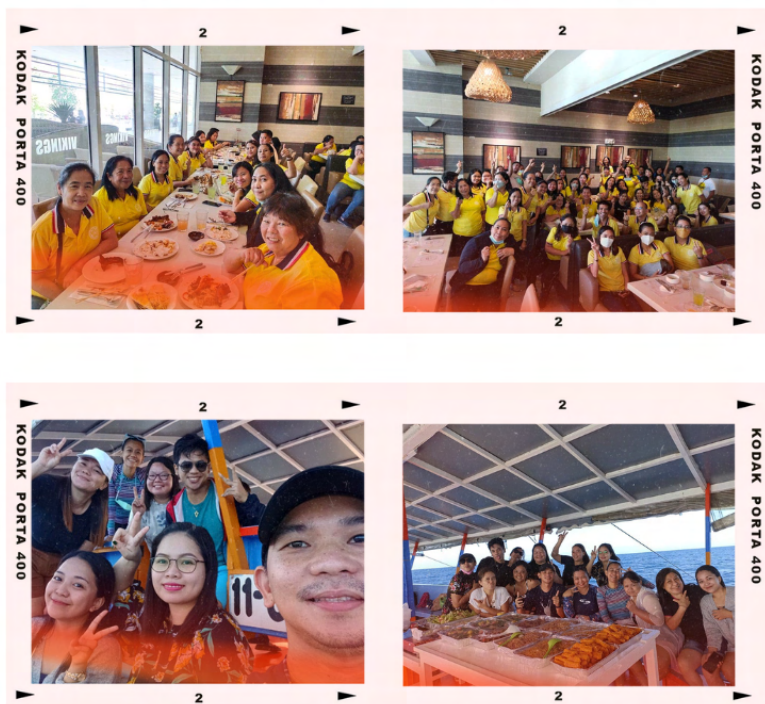


